Inter-institutional agreement 2020/21 between programme countries

Minimum requirements for the sector of Higher Music Education

The Institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students and/or staff in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects related to the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of credits (or equivalent) awarded to students by the partner institution. G. Termination of the agreement




The contract automatically expires with the end of its validity.
